**1** House Bill No. 1213 of the Twelfth Legislature, Regular Session of 1983, proposes that Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii be amended to eliminate the requirement that excess revenue be refunded to taxpayers if the general fund balance at the close of each two successive fiscal years exceeds five percent of general fund revenues for each of the two fiscal years.

**2** House Bill No. 1947 of the Twelfth Legislature, Regular Session of 1984, proposes that Article III, Section 12 of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii be amended to allow the legislature to establish the deadline for introducing bills to be considered at any time during the session, by eliminating the current requirement that the deadline be no sooner than the twentieth day of the session and before the mandatory legislative recess.

**3** Senate Bill No. 2072 of the Twelfth Legislature, Regular Session of 1984, proposes that Article III, Section 9 of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii be amended to allow the legislature to set the method (but not the amount) by which its members will be paid. The legislature has passed a bill to provide for payment in equal monthly installments, with no increase in pay.

**4** House Bill No. 1948 of the Twelfth Legislature, Regular Session of 1984, proposes that Article III, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, which now requires the legislature to recess each regular session for not less than five days at one time during the period between the twentieth and fortieth days of the session, be amended to remove the requirement that the recess of at least five days be taken consecutively or all at one time, and allow the recess to be taken any time during the session after the deadline for introducing bills. A concurrent resolution setting the dates of the mandatory recess must be adopted by the majority vote of the members of each house of the legislature.

#### ARTICLE III LEGISLATIVE BRANCH COUNTY COUNCIL

County Council: Composition and Terms

Present Provision: Section 3-2 of the Charter of the County of Hawaii presently provides for a nine-member council, six being residents of six geographical areas and three at-large. All members serve four-year terms.

Proposed Amendment: Section 3-2 of the Charter of the County of Hawaii would be amended to provide that, "One member shall be elected by the qualified voters from each of the nine council districts as established by the county reapportionment commission." In addition, under new Section 3-2.1 a reapportionment commission would be created to apportion the council seats every eight years. The first election under the reapportionment plan would be held in 1988. No residency requirements for the council members are stated. All council members would serve four-year terms.
