

# Instructions for Voting on the Automatic Voting Machines

1. MOVE the RED Operating Lever Over to the Right Till the Bell Rings.
2. Turn down the voting lever over the word "YES" to vote in favor of Retention of Judges. For a negative vote, turn down the voting lever over the word "NO".

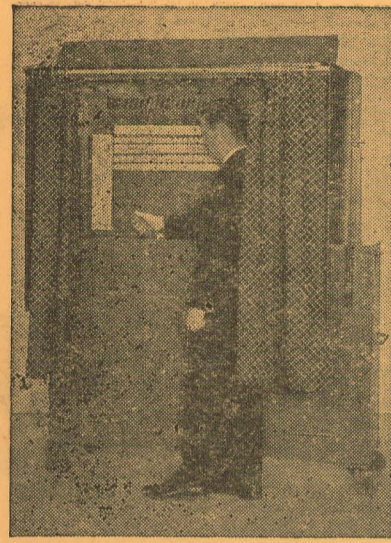
3. Pull the Lever (Indicated by the  on this Sample Ballot) of your party to the right. To vote a split ticket: After you have pulled the Party Lever, turn

up the Voting Lever (Indicated by  on this Sample Ballot) over the candidate's name you wish to cut out, and turn the Voting Lever

4. Leave The Voting Levers Down.
5. Move the Red Operating Lever to the Left.

## IMPORTANT!

The Voter Indicates His Choice by Turning Down a Lever Over Each Name for Which He Wishes to Vote. No Vote Is Registered Until the Red Operating Lever Is Moved to the Left to Open the Curtains. If you Wish to Change Your Choice You can Do So by Returning Any Lever to the Unvoted Position and Turn Down Another in Its Stead—Before Moving the Red Lever to the Left.

# SAMPLE BALLOT

If the voter desires to vote a straight ticket he can do so by making a cross or a check in the circle thus [X] or [✓]. If the voter does not desire to vote a straight ticket he can make a cross or a check [X] or [✓] in the square over the name of any candidate for whom he desires to vote.

If there is more than one candidate to be elected for any office and the voter does not want to vote for all the candidates of his party for such office, he should place a cross or a check in the square over the name of each candidate for such office for whom he desires to vote.

If you mark a cross or check in the square over the name of more candidates than can be elected to any office, YOUR VOTE AS TO THAT OFFICE WILL NOT BE COUNTED.

In marking the ballot the cross or check MUST be made inside the circle or square. DO NOT scratch out or cancel with pen or pencil any name on the ballot. DO NOT scratch out, or mark, or deface, any ticket which you do not vote.
