A PARLIAMENTARY DEMOCRACY

New Zealand is a democratic country in which members of the single chamber of Parliament are chosen in free and fair elections through universal suffrage of all citizens and permanent residents aged 18 years and over.

The term of Parliament is fixed by law. Every New Zealand citizen who is enrolled as an elector is eligible to be a candidate for election as a Member of Parliament. Once the House of Representatives (Parliament) has been dissolved or has expired a general election must be held within a certain time prescribed by law.

As in many other countries which inherited their system of government from Britain, New Zealand follows important elements of the Westminster model of parliamentary government. The major elements of the parliamentary system of government as it has evolved in New Zealand are:

- Important parts of the constitution remain unwritten.
- Each Parliament is legally entitled to change or repeal any law passed by its predecessors (although a larger majority may be required to do so in some cases, e.g. the 'reserved' or 'entrenched' sections of the Electoral Act 1993 and the Constitution Act 1986).
- Parliament is elected by a proportional electoral system known as Mixed Member Proportional (MMP).
- Apart from periods of caretaker government, a government must always have the 'confidence' of at least half the MPs who vote in the House of Representatives on certain crucial votes, called 'votes of confidence'.
- A member of the Executive (i.e. a Minister or an Under-Secretary) must be, or must become, a Member of Parliament.
- The government is accountable to Parliament for its actions and policies and Ministers are answerable in Parliament for their own actions and policies and for the actions and policies of the departments and state agencies under their jurisdiction.
- Most Ministers are members of Cabinet, which is the main decision-making body in government and meets regularly and in secret.

- There is collective Cabinet responsibility, which means that all members of the Executive are expected to support a Cabinet decision, even if they were against it at a Cabinet meeting or were not present at the Cabinet meeting at which the decision was made.
- The judiciary is independent and free from political direction.
- The public service is non-partisan and serves an elected government whatever its party composition.

New Zealand is a constitutional monarchy in which the monarch, the Queen of New Zealand (also called the sovereign and symbolised by the Crown) is the Head of State.

The Governor-General is the Queen's representative in New Zealand. He or she is appointed by the Queen on the advice of the New Zealand Government. The Governor-General has all the powers of the Queen in relation to New Zealand. Although an integral part of the process of government, the Queen and the Governor-General remain politically neutral and do not get involved in the political contest.

The principal functions of Parliament are to provide a Government, enact laws, supervise the Government's administration, vote supply, and redress grievances by way of petition.

The Government cannot act effectively without Parliament because it cannot raise or spend money without parliamentary approval. For most categories of expenditure this approval takes the form of an annual vote of funds to the Government.

Enrolment system

The enrolment of electors is co-ordinated by the **Electoral Enrolment Centre**. Rolls of registered electors for each electorate are maintained on an on-going basis by a Registrar of Electors appointed for each electorate. See Pages 145-154 for contact details of individual Registrars. Information collected for the parliamentary electoral roll is also used to compile local authority electoral rolls and to make up lists of potential jury members.

a New Zealand citizen or a permanent resident of New Zealand and must have lived in the country for at least one year at some stage during their life. They must also have lived continuously for at least one month at the address for which they apply to be registered.

To register as an elector a person must be at least 18 years old.

Once a person has registered, he or she must let a Registrar of Electors know whenever they shift to a new address. They do this by filling in a 'Change of Address Request' which like enrolment forms can be obtained from any New Zealand Post Shop or postal agency. In every year in which Parliament is due to expire each elector will receive a letter from the Electoral Enrolment Centre which gives details of their enrolment. Each elector is asked to check these details, make any necessary changes and return the form to their local Registrar of Electors in the envelope provided.

New Zealand citizens who have been overseas for three years or less, and permanent residents who have been overseas for 12 months or less, remain on the roll of the electorate for which they were last enrolled.

A person who does not want his or her name to be printed in the roll for their electorate because it could be prejudicial to their personal safety can ask to have their name included on the unpublished roll. This means that they will have to cast a special vote at election time but the electoral roll will not be able to be used by anyone to find their address.

The MMP Voting System

The 1996 general election was the first to elect a Parliament under the MMP voting system. The system was introduced after the second and final referendum held in conjunction with the 1993 general election. See Page 110.

There are usually 120 Members of Parliament under the MMP voting system. In 1996, 65 MPs were elected to represent the 60 General Electorates and 5 Maori Electorates. The other 55 MPs were elected from lists of candidates nominated by registered political parties.

Under MMP, each person who is registered as an elector for a General Electorate or a Maori Electorate can cast two votes, both of which are on a single ballot paper. For a sample ballot form see Pages 16-17.

The Party Vote shows all the registered political parties who have nominated a party list for the general election.

The other vote, the Electorate Vote, is for an electorate MP to represent the General or Maori electorate for which the voter is registered as an elector.

The candidate in each electorate who wins more Electorate Votes than any other candidate is declared elected as the Member of Parliament for that electorate.

In general, each registered party's total number of Party Votes decides its share of all 120 seats in Parliament. However, a registered party must cross the 'threshold' before it is entitled to a share of all the seats based on its total number of Party Votes: either it must win at least 5 percent of all the Party Votes cast at the election, or it must win at least one General or Maori electorate seat.

Each party that crosses the threshold will receive enough list seats to add to any electorate seats it has won so that its share of the total 120 seats is close to its share of the 'effective Party Votes' cast at the election.

Parties which get list seats fill those seats from the list of candidates they nominated before the general election. List candidates become MPs in the order they are shown on their party's list. Voters cannot change a party's ordering of its list candidates and any dual candidate who wins an electorate seat has his or her name deleted from the party list.

THE ELECTORAL AGENCIES

Several agencies have a major role in the administration of the parliamentary electoral system. Their functions can be summarised as follows:

Representation Commission

Determines boundaries of General and Maori electorates after each five-yearly population census and Maori Electoral Option.

The Commission's membership comprises a chairman (normally a judge of the District Court) the Surveyor-General, the Government Statistician, the Chief Electoral Officer, the chairman of the Local Government Commission and two appointed members to represent the Government and Opposition parties. The Chief Executive of Te Puni Kokiri joins the Commission for the purposes of determining the Maori electoral districts and there are two further appointed Maori members to represent the Government and the Opposition parties. Secretarial services are provided by the Chief Electoral Office. As soon as it has done its work the Representation 🗾 1 🗷 Commission goes out of existence until it is required again following the next census.




GENERAL ELECTORATES NORTH ISLAND, 1996





SETTING ELECTORATE BOUNDARIES

New Zealand's electorate boundaries are set by an independent Representation Commission after each five yearly census. This is done on the basis of total ordinary resident population (adults and children) and not on the basis of the number of people who have registered as electors.

Each set of electorate boundaries comes into effect for general elections as soon as the Representation Commission delivers its report to the Governor-General and publishes the new boundaries in the New Zealand Gazette. The boundaries last until the next set is finalised after the next population census. If there is a by-election it will use the same boundaries as the previous general election.

Because there are two types of electorate-Maori and General—the law defines two types of population around which the boundaries of each kind of electorate can be drawn.

The Government Statistician calculates the 'Maori electoral population' by:

- (a) calculating the ratio of the number of people registered on all the Maori electoral rolls compared to the total number of people on all the electoral rolls, General and Maori, who said they were of Maori descent when they last enrolled; then
- (b) applying that proportion to the total number of people (adults and children) who said they were of Maori descent at the most recent population census.

The 'General electoral population' is the total ordinary resident population compiled during the latest census minus the Maori electoral population.

After each census the process of redrawing electorate boundaries begins with a four-month Maori Electoral Option. During this period, electors who are registered on

the Maori roll and those on the General roll who indicated on their enrolment forms that they are of Maori descent are sent a letter asking them to choose which type of roll they want to be registered on—the Maori electoral roll or the General electoral roll.

Once they have made their choice the person cannot change the type of roll they are registered on until the next Maori Electoral Option is held in five years time. If Maori who are already registered as electors do not make a choice during the Maori Electoral Option period, they stay on the type of roll they were already on.

The results of the Maori Electoral Option form the basis for calculating the Maori electoral population and the General electoral population, and affect the number of Maori seats there will be for the next five to eight years. They also affect the boundaries of all seats, General and Maori. So the process of drawing electorate boundaries cannot begin until the Maori Electoral Option has been held.

The number of Maori electorate seats can rise or fall depending on the number of Maori who choose to be registered on the Maori electoral roll. A change in the number of Maori seats can affect the number of General seats in the North Island and the number of list seats.

There are presently five Maori electorate seats in Parliament, but as a result of the 1997 Maori Electoral Option there will be six contested at the 1999 general election.

The number of General electorate seats in the South lsland is fixed at 16.

Each electorate must have an electoral population that is within ± 5 per cent (i.e. between 95% and 105%) of its appropriate quota. The quotas and population ranges for the electorate boundaries to be drawn following the 1996 census and the 1997 Maori Electoral Option are as follows:

The Representation Commission must also consider the following factors when it draws the electorate boundaries –

- I. Existing electorate boundaries.
- Community of interest. When drawing the boundaries
 of the Maori electorates, the Commission must also
 take into account community of interest among
 members of Maori tribes.
- 3. Communications links.
- 4. Topographical features such as mountains and rivers.
- 5. Any anticipated changes such as above average growth or decline in each electorate's population between one set of boundaries and the next.

This vote is for one of the candidates for the General or Maori electorate for which the voter is enrolled. The candidate who gets the most votes becomes the MP for that electorate.

To qualify

a registered party must cross the threshold by winning at least 5% of all the Party Votes by winning at least 1 General or Maori electorate seat...

If an electorate seat is won by an Independent candidate or by a candidate for a party that isn't on the Party Vote, the number of seats shared among qualifying parties is a reduced accordingly.

Each qualifying party's share of all 120 seats in Parliament is decided by its share of the Party Votes cast for all the qualifying parties.

A qualifying party doesn't get any list seats in if it wins more electorate seats than the total number of seats it is entitled to. However it keeps the extra seats it has won [called 'overhang seats'] and the number of seats in Parliament is increased by the number of overhang seats until the next general election. The number of seats won by other parties is not changed.

If a qualifying party's share of the Party Votes entitles it to more seats than the number of electorate seats it has won, it gets enough list seats to add to its electorate seats to bring it up to the number it should have.

A party's list seats are filled by candidates in the order they appear on the party's list after deleting any candidate who has won an electorate seat.



ALLOCATION OF PARTY LIST SEATS

The number of Party Votes won by each registered party which has submitted a party list and crossed the threshold is used to decide how many seats overall each party will have in Parliament. These parties are eligible for list seats and will receive enough list seats to add to their electorate seats to reach the total number of seats to which they are entitled.

If, for example, the Party Votes for a particular party entitled it to a total of 54 seats in Parliament and it won 40 electorate seats, it would gain 14 further seats drawn from its party list. Candidates may stand for Parliament both in an electorate and on their party's list.

To determine the precise order in which all the seats in Parliament are allocated to the various parties, the Electoral Act 1993 prescribes that a mathematical formula, called the St Laguë formula, be applied. The nationwide Party Vote of each of the parties which cross the threshold is divided by successive odd numbers starting with I (i.e. the number of Party Votes won by each party is divided by 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, etc.). The 120 highest resulting numbers (which are called quotients) determine both the number of seats for each party and the order in which they are allocated. The following explains how the process worked at the 1996 general election:

The St Laguë Formula

Step I:

The Chief Electoral Officer drew up a table with the name of each party shown on the Party Vote side of the ballot paper, the number of Party Votes it won, the percentage of all Party Votes it won and the number of electorate seats it won. For the purposes of this table minor parties are combined under the heading 'OTHER'.

The Chief Electoral Officer then excluded parties that were not eligible for party list seats by deleting any party that had not won at least 5% of the total number of Party Votes or had not won at least one electorate seat (commonly termed the threshold). The Christian Coalition had only gained 4.33% of all the Party Votes and had not won any electorates seats, so all votes for the Christian Coalition and other parties in the same situation are excluded. Although the United New Zealand Party gained 0.88% of all the Party Votes it did win one electorate seat, so is included.

Note: The percentage share for each of the remaining parties has increased because Party Votes for parties not reaching the threshold have been disregarded.

Step 3:

The Chief Electoral Officer then took the total Party Votes for each eligible party and divided the figures by a sequence of odd numbers starting with 1 (1,3,5,7,9,11,13,15 and so on),

until enough quotients had been found to allocate all 120 seats. The numbers beside the highest 120 quotients on the following table indicate their order from highest to lowest.

Step 4:

The Chief Electoral Officer then counted the number of quotients each party had in the highest 120.

Step 5:

The Chief Electoral Officer then determined how many electorate seats each party had won, and allocated enough party list seats to each party to bring the total number of seats up to the number to which it was entitled.

☐ Step 6

The Chief Electoral Officer then examined the list of candidates each party submitted on its party list before the election, and deleted the names of any candidate who had won an electorate seat. He then allocated the party's list seats to the remaining list candidates in the order they appear on the party's list. He then declared those candidates elected to Parliament and advised the Clerk of the House of Representatives of their names.

The list of MPs elected at the 1996 general election appears on Pages 24 and 25.

There are four further points to note.

- I. If a party that appeared on the Party Vote side of the ballot paper wins more electorate seats than it is entitled to based on its share of the Party Vote, then it does not receive any list seats. It keeps the extra seats and the size of Parliament increases by that number of seats until the next general election. The number of seats won by other parties are not affected.
- 2. If a party does not nominate enough list candidates to fill all the seats to which it is entitled on the basis of its share of the Party Vote, they remain unfilled and the size of Parliament is reduced by that number of seats until the next general election. The number of seats won by other parties are not affected.
- 3. If an electorate seat is won by an Independent candidate or by a party that did not appear on the Party Vote (e.g. because it was not a registered party), the Chief Electoral Officer would subtract that number of seats from 120 and work out allocations of seats between registered parties based on that lower number.
- 4. The list nominated by a party at a general election remains in force until the next general election, and it is used to replace a list MP from that party in the event of death, resignation or disqualification. In 1997 Jim Gerard resigned from Parliament and the Chief Electoral Officer asked Annabel Young if she was willing to be an MP (having first confirmed that she was still a member of the National Party). She agreed and was then declared elected to Parliament. If she had not agreed, the Chief Electoral Officer would have asked the next candidate on the list and so on until a candidate was willing to become an MP. If no such candidate was found the seat would remain unfilled until the next general election.

A by-election is held to fill a casual vacancy in an electorate seat. However, Parliament may, by resolution supported by 75% of all MPs, decide not to fill a vacant list or electorate seat if the vacancy occurs within six months of the date Parliament is due to expire or if the Prime Minister has announced that a general election is to be held within six months of the date the vacancy occurred.

REGISTRATION OF POLITICAL PARTIES

In order to be able to contest the Party Vote political parties have to be registered with the Electoral Commission before Writ Day. While independent candidates and members of an unregistered party can contest electorate seats using their party name, they are not able to contest the Party Vote. In some cases, parties may stand in an election as a component group of another registered party.

Before they can be used on the ballot paper party logos have to be approved and registered by the Electoral Commission. Both registered and unregistered parties may register a logo.





By law, all registered parties	must furnish a r	eturn of their election

By law, all registered parties must furnish a return of their election expenses to the Electoral Commission within 70 days after the day on which successful list candidates are announced by the Chief Electoral Officer. This return must be audited. Returns and auditors' reports are available for public inspection.

All candidates for electorate seats must furnish details of their election expenses to the particular electorate's Returning Officer within 70 days of the day on which the successful electorate candidate is declared elected.

Under the Electoral Act 1993 all registered parties must provide the Electoral Commission with an annual return of national donations and of electorate donations, no later than 30 April each year. The return of national donations has to be audited. Returns and auditors' reports are available for public inspection.

See the Electoral Glossary for definitions of 'electorate donation' and 'national donation'.

By law, all registered parties must use democratic procedures to select their parliamentary candidates.

CITIZENS INITIATED REFERENDA

Under the Citizens Initiated Referenda Act 1993, a petition of at least 10 percent of electors can request that a non-binding referendum be held on virtually any subject. There are a number of steps in the process:

- The promoter gives the referendum proposal to the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- The Clerk publicly advertises the proposed question. The Act allows 28 days for submissions and a further three months for the determination of the final wording of the question.
 - After consulting with the promoter and any other person, the Clerk determines the final wording of the referendum question.
- The promoter has to gather the signatures of at least 10 percent of registered electors and deliver the petition to the Clerk within 12 months of the publication of the determination.
 - The petition is checked for compliance. If all is correct the Speaker presents the petition to the House of Representatives. If it is not correct, the promoter is allowed a further two months to make it comply before it lapses.
- The Governor-General sets a date for the referendum within one month from the date of presentation. The referendum must be held within a year of the date of presentation unless 75 percent of all MPs in Parliament vote to defer it.
- The referendum is held and the result is declared. The result is indicative only and is not binding on the Government.

There has been one citizens initiated referendum to date.

ALLOCATION OF ELECTION **BROADCASTING TIME AND MONEY**

The responsibility for the allocation of election broadcasting time and funds to eligible political parties was transferred from the Broadcasting Standards Authority to the Electoral Commission in July 1996. At the same time there were changes to the criteria political parties must meet to be eligible for an allocation and for the allocation of election broadcasting time and funds.



single-party government:

a majority government or a minority government made up of only one political party. See also coalition government.

snap election:

see early election.

Sovereign:

Queen Elizabeth the Second as Queen of New Zealand. See also **Head of State**.

special vote:

a vote cast at a general election, by-election, or referendum by a voter who is unable to cast an ordinary vote. See also **Tangata Whenua vote.**

St Laguë formula:

the formula (usually pronounced 'Saint La-gu') used by the Chief Electoral Officer under the MMP system to allocate seats to registered political parties that have crossed the threshold according to their shares of the effective Party Votes.

supply:

parliamentary authority for a government to spend public money and incur expenses or liabilities; the granting of supply by Parliament is always a matter of confidence in the government.

Tangata Whenua vote:

a particular type of special vote used by those on the Maori roll.

term of Parliament:

the maximum period of three years between the return of the writs for a general election and the expiry of Parliament; set by the Constitution Act 1986 and entrenched by the Electoral Act 1993.

threshold:

the requirement under MMP for a political party that is on the Party Vote to win at least 5 percent of all the Party Votes or at least one electorate seat in order to qualify for a share of all the seats based on its share of the effective Party Votes.

unregistered political party:

a political party that is not entered on the Register of Political Parties, and can therefore only nominate electorate candidates. See also registered political party.

vacant seat:

see casual vacancy.

valid vote:

a vote at a general election, by-election or referendum that is not a disallowed vote or an informal vote.

vote of confidence:

see confidence.

voter:

a person who votes at a general election, by-election, or referendum.

voting paper:

a paper on which voters mark their choice at a referendum or poll. See also ballot paper

voting system:

a method of translating the votes of the people into seats in the legislature. See also First-Past-the-Post; Mixed Member Proportional.

Westminster system:

a system of parliamentary government found in the UK and in many former British colonies which in general has most of the following characteristics (although they have evolved in different ways in

different places and may exist to varying degrees): responsible government; members of the government are required to be Members of Parliament; a Parliament that is legally entitled to amend or repeal any law passed by its predecessors; a constitution with important parts that are unwritten; a non-partisan public service; and an independent judiciary.

writ:

a written direction from the Clerk of the Writs to a Returning Officer to hold an election in his or her electorate for an electorate MP for that electorate, or to hold a referendum in that electorate. See also election day; nomination day; polling day; return of the writs.

writ day:

the day on which the Clerk of the Writs issues a writ to a Returning Officer. In the case of a general election or referendum, all writs for all electorates are issued on the same day. See also **return of the writs**.
