

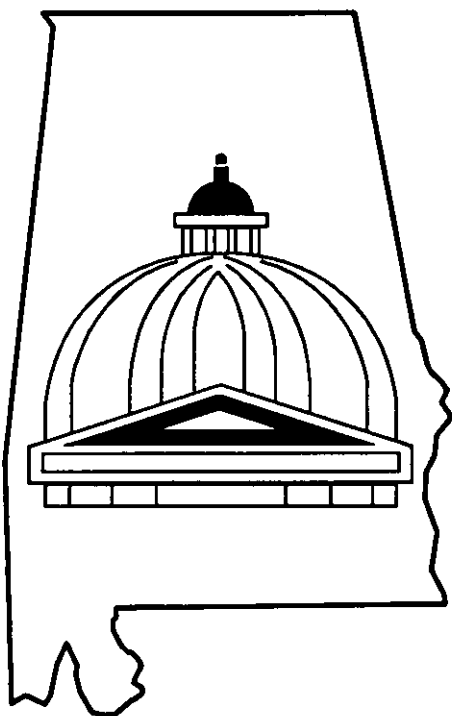

The Choice is Yours...

The *National Voter Registration Act* provides for three new voter registration programs in the State of Alabama.

You now have the opportunity of registering to vote at a wider variety of places.

Motor Voter.

The *National Voter Registration Act* was commonly referred to as the "Motor Voter" bill because one part of the new law allows you to apply to register to vote when you apply for your State of Alabama driver's license or identification card.



You may also apply to register to vote when you *renew* your State of Alabama driver's

license or your identification card.

Please check with your local probate office or license commissioner's office for further details.

Agency-Based Voter Registration.

Under the *National Voter Registration Act*, the State of Alabama has also made voter registration available at selected state and local government offices.



You may apply to register to vote when you apply for services or recertify for services at any of these offices:

Department of Human Resources (Food Stamp and AFDC programs)

Department of Public Health (WIC program)

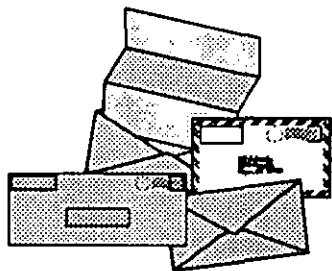
Department of Rehabilitation Services

Alabama Medicaid Agency

County and select Municipal public libraries

Postcard Voter Registration.

Starting in 1995, for the first time in our state's history you may apply to register to vote through the mail.



For your convenience, Alabama's new postcard voter registration form is available at the following locations:

Probate judges' offices

License commissioners' offices

All of the offices listed under the Agency-Based Voter Registration program

All public four-year universities and colleges

Select private four-year universities and colleges

Public Schools

To apply to register to vote by mail, pick up a postcard voter registration form at any one of these participating locations, fill it out *completely*, and mail it back to your county's Board of Registrars.

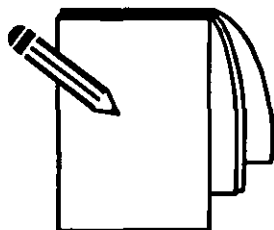

The National Voter Registration Act of 1993

The *National Voter Registration Act* was enacted in 1993.

In passing the Act, the United States Congress reaffirmed that citizens of the United States possess a fundamental right to vote. It also concluded that federal, state, and local governments have a duty to promote the exercise of that right.

One way to promote the exercise of the right to vote is to make voter registration available at more locations that are convenient to the public.

Therefore, under the Act, Congress has established three new programs for registering eligible citizens to vote in Alabama and other states:

Motor Voter

Agency-based voter registration

Postcard voter registration
