VOTER INSTRUCTIONS

Who may vote?

In order to vote on election day you must be registered to vote at the address at which you reside.

If a voter moves outside the precinct within 30 days of the election, he or she may vote by affidavit in the old precinct.

If a voter moves within 28 days of the election within the precinct, he or she may vote by completing the appropriate affidavit.

How do I find my polling place?

Find the precinct number on your voters registration card. This number will designate your polling place.

See the list of Precinct Polling Places and addresses on page 4 of this publication.

Who may vote absentee?

Absentee voting provisions are designed to permit qualified voters to cast ballots outside of their election day precinct polling place.

To vote by absentee ballot, you must be a registered voter unable to vote at your polling place on election day for one of the following reasons:

1. You expect to be absent from your county of residence.
2. You are physically unable to go to the polling place.
3. You will be observing a religious holiday.
4. You will be performing certain election duties.
5. You are a sequestered juror.

Persons desiring to vote by absentee ballot must state the reason for doing so under oath. All absentee ballots should be marked in secret and returned to the county clerk's office by mailing in the envelope provided or the ballot may be delivered in person by the voter to the county clerk's office.

Mail applications for absentee ballot must be received by the county clerk's office no later than Thurs., March 14, 1996. The last day for in person absentee voting is Mon., March 18, 1996. The office will be open Sat., March 16 from 8:30 a.m. to noon to accommodate persons wishing to vote an absentee

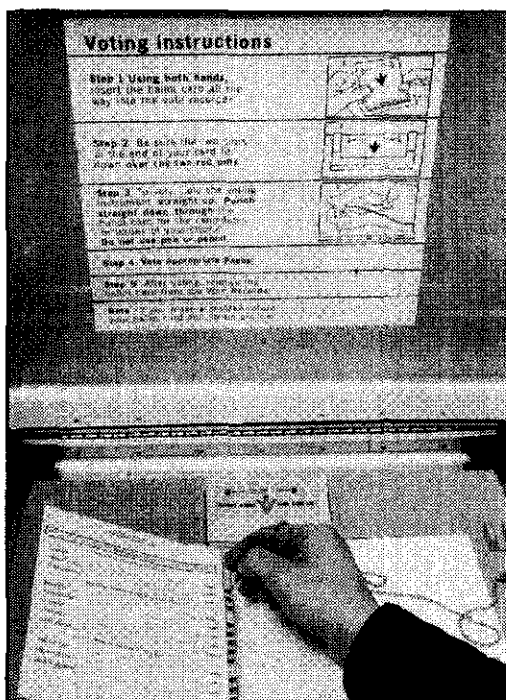
Any qualified registered voter desiring to vote on election day shall, upon entering the polling place, state his or her name and residence to the Election Judges. The voter shall sign the appropriate application to vote, certifying that he/she is a qualified registered voter. Ballots are color-coded for the appropriate ballot type. Due to split districts, there will be various colors in some precincts.

Before entering the voting booth, each voter will be offered instruction in the operation of the vote recorder on a model by one of the judges. Voting aids (magnifier lens and large stylus) are available upon request.

If you make an error while voting, return your ballot to the election judge to receive another ballot. You may not vote for more candidates than the number to be nominated or elected. If over-voted, your vote cannot be counted for the office.

The stylus (punch) attached to the vote recorder must be the only instrument used to punch your ballot card. You must not fold, tear, or mutilate the ballot card or write on it with a pen or pencil. This would cause your vote to not be counted. After you remove your ballot from the recorder, check the back of your card to ensure all punches are complete. Place your voted ballot in the envelope provided so that the punches do not show and give your ballot to the Election Judge stationed at the ballot box. The Election Judge shall immediately remove the stub off the ballot at the perforation and insert the ballot into the ballot box.

How do I use the vote recorder to vote?



STEP 1

Using both hands, slide the ballot card all the way into the Vote Recorder.

STEP 2

Be sure the two holes at the top of the card fit over the two red pins on the Vote Recorder.

STEP 3

To vote, hold the punch straight up and push down through the card for each of your choices. Vote all pages. Use the punch provided. Do not use pen or pencil.

STEP 4

After voting, slide the card out of the Vote Recorder (make sure the punches go completely through the card) and place it under the flap in the ballot card envelope. If you make a mistake, ask for another ballot.

How do I use the absentee ballot punch card?

READ SPECIMEN BALLOT. Note the title of the office and the number of candidates for which you may vote plus the propositions. Proceed through the ballot and circle the appropriate number for each selection. This will make it easier for you to punch out your ballot card. **DO NOT SELECT TOO MANY CANDIDATES! VOTES WILL NOT BE COUNTED IN ANY CONTEST WHICH HAS BEEN OVER-VOTED.**

PUNCH BALLOT CARD. Place the ballot card, which is stapled to a foam pad, onto a flat surface. Use the wire punch to punch out the black dots on the ballot card which correspond to numbers from the specimen ballot. **PUSH THE WIRE PUNCH COMPLETELY THROUGH THE BALLOT CARD INTO FOAM PAD.** Check the back of the ballot to ensure that you have punched through the ballot.

WRITE-IN-VOTES. On the right flap of the ballot card envelope is a space for write-in votes. The title of the office must be printed or written. Make an "X" within a box under the title of office. Print or write the name of candidate to the right of "X" under title of office.

RETURN VOTED BALLOT. Carefully tear off the perforated stub to remove the ballot card from foam backing. Insert the ballot card into the ballot card envelope which maintains the secrecy of your vote. (See picture at right.)

SIGNATURE. The certification envelope must be completely filled out and signed by the voter.

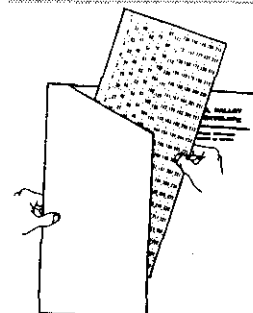
SEAL BALLOT. After the ballot card has been inserted into the ballot card envelope, seal the ballot card envelope in the certification envelope. (Do not return the foam pad, specimen ballot, or the wire punch.)

MAIL AT ONCE. Place certification envelope in return envelope and mail to the County Clerk's office.

When you vote absentee...

you will receive a kit containing a specimen ballot, ballot card, foam pad, ballot card envelope, wire punch, certification envelope, and return envelope.

If you spoil or damage your ballot card, you may return the entire kit in the return envelope with a written request for a new absentee voter's kit.

A Message to Voters...

Dear Elector,

At the Primary Election, voters will select the Republican and Democratic Party nominees for the offices to be filled at the November General Election. Party officers will be elected at this time.

In order to participate in the Republican or Democratic Primary, the voter must declare his or her party affiliation to the election judges. The qualified voter will receive only the primary ballot associated with the party of his or her choice. The voter may declare affiliation with either party regardless of how he or she voted in the past.

Voters residing in Tri-Point Community Unit School District 6J may request a nonpartisan ballot. A voter need not declare any party affiliation to vote in nonpartisan elections. Candidates and/or referenda will appear on the appropriate primary ballots as well as on separate ballots for voters not wanting to vote in the partisan primary elections.

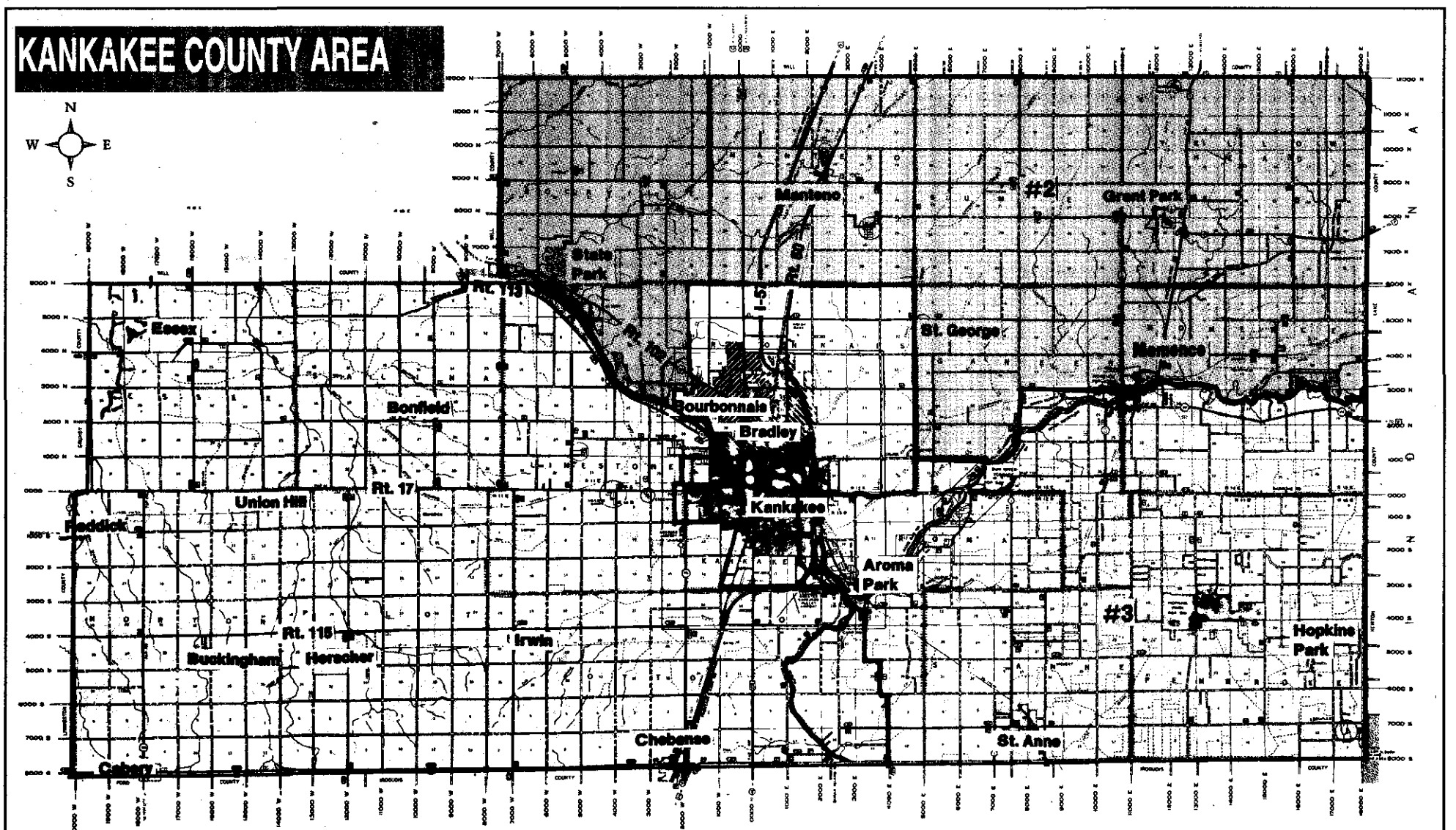
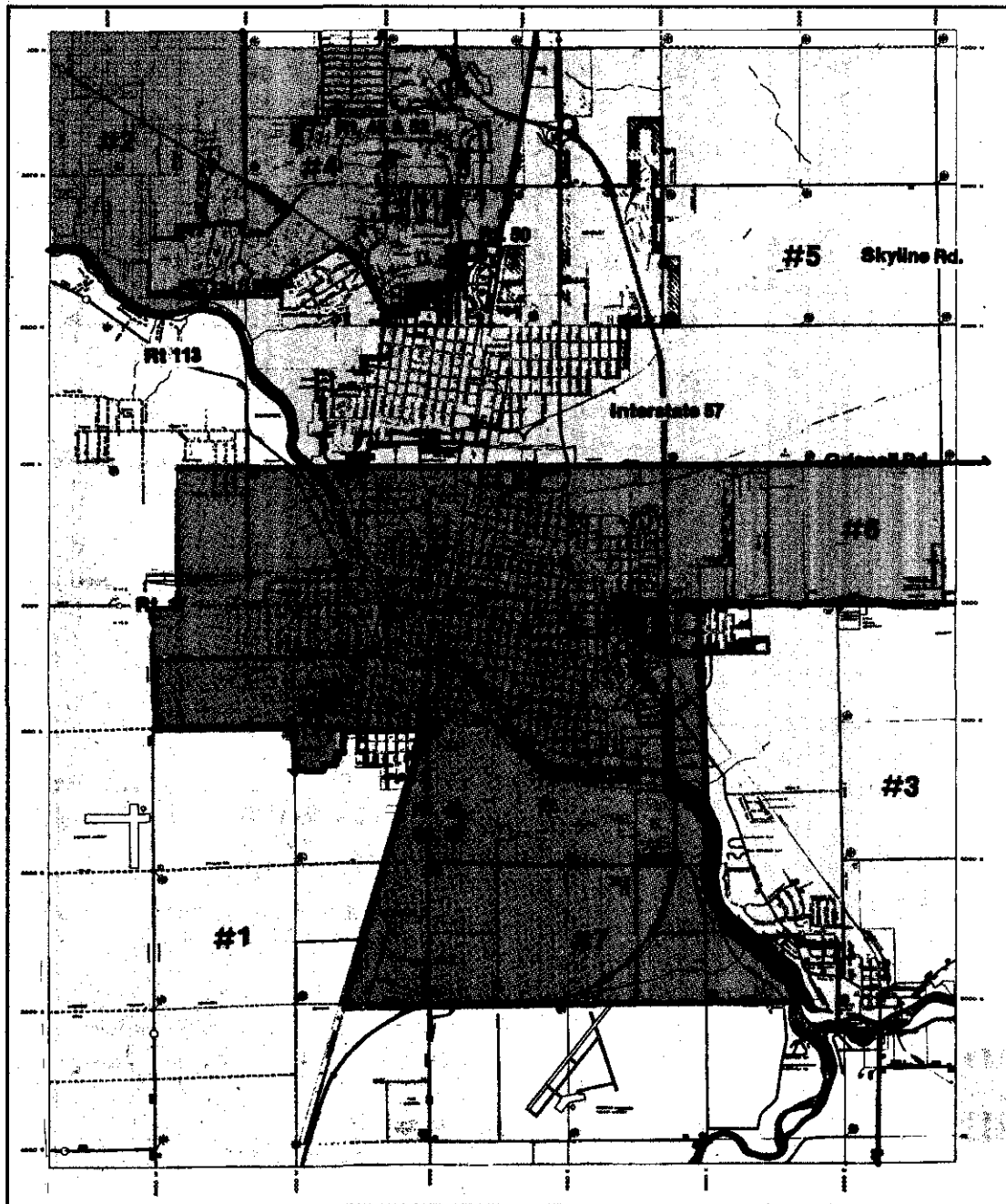
The passage of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA) allows individuals who registered under this law to vote for Federal Offices only. Your voter identification card will indicate "Federal Office Only" if you registered under NVRA. If you have been previously registered or registered under Illinois law you will vote a full ballot.

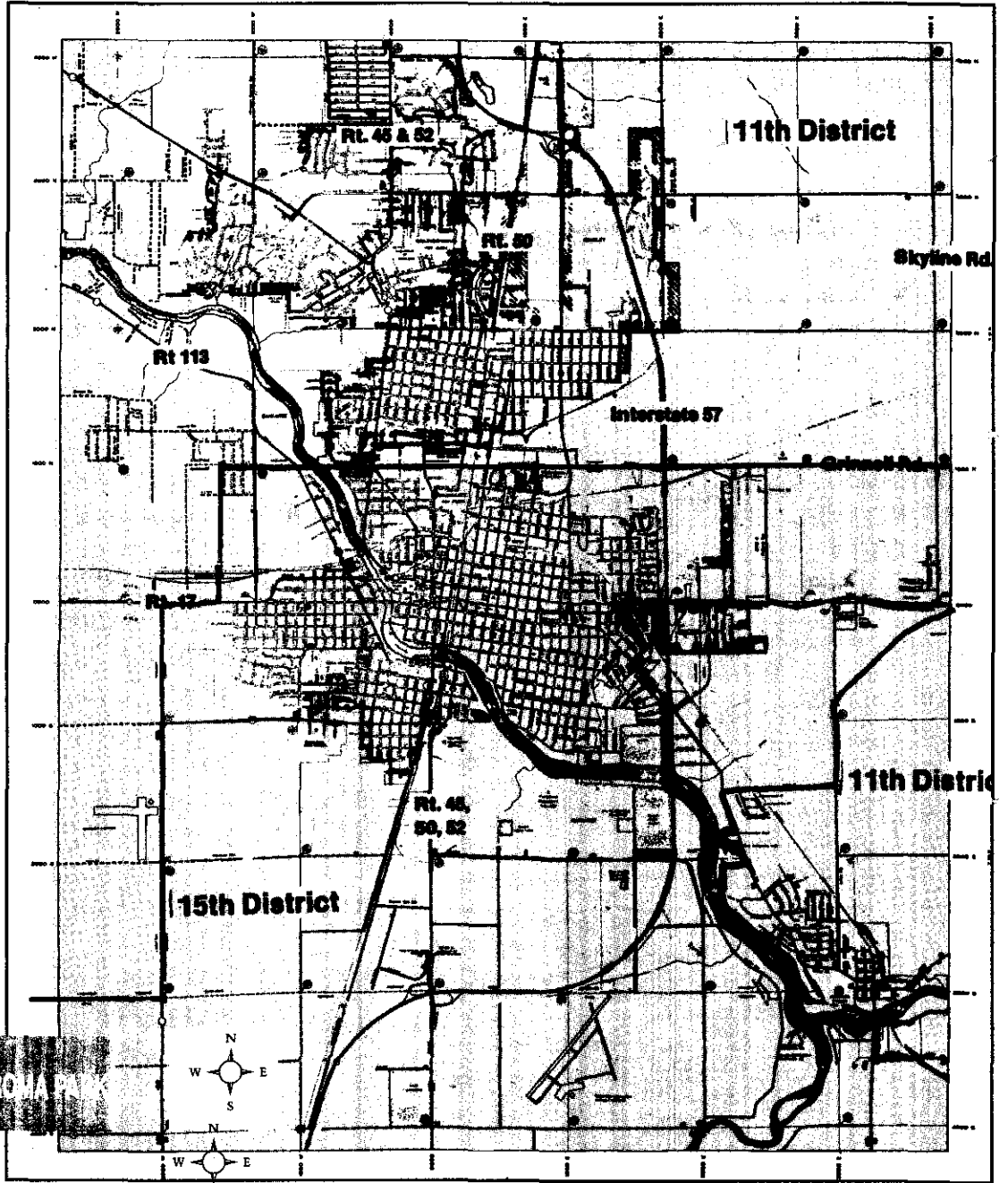
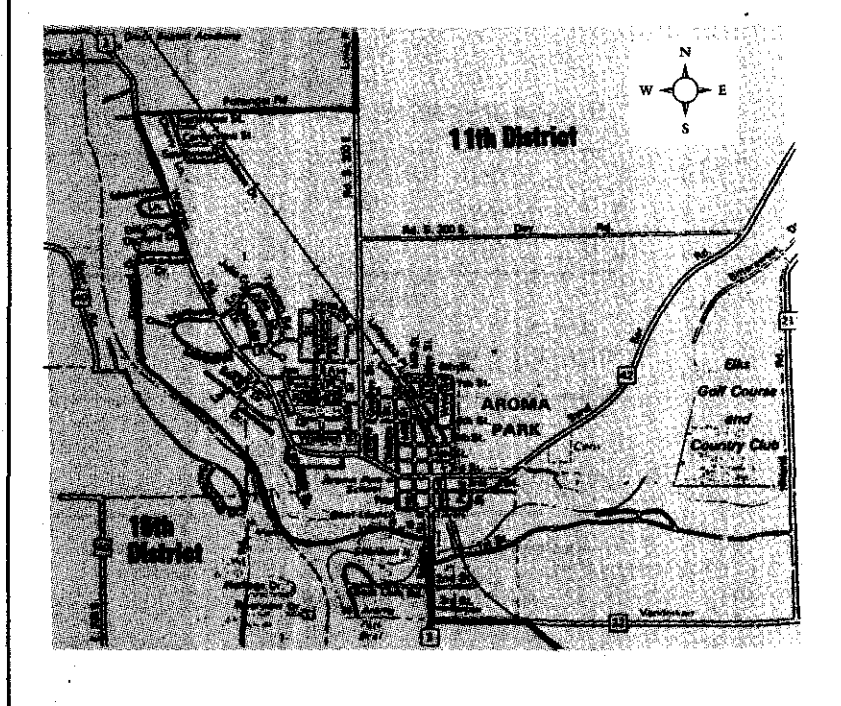

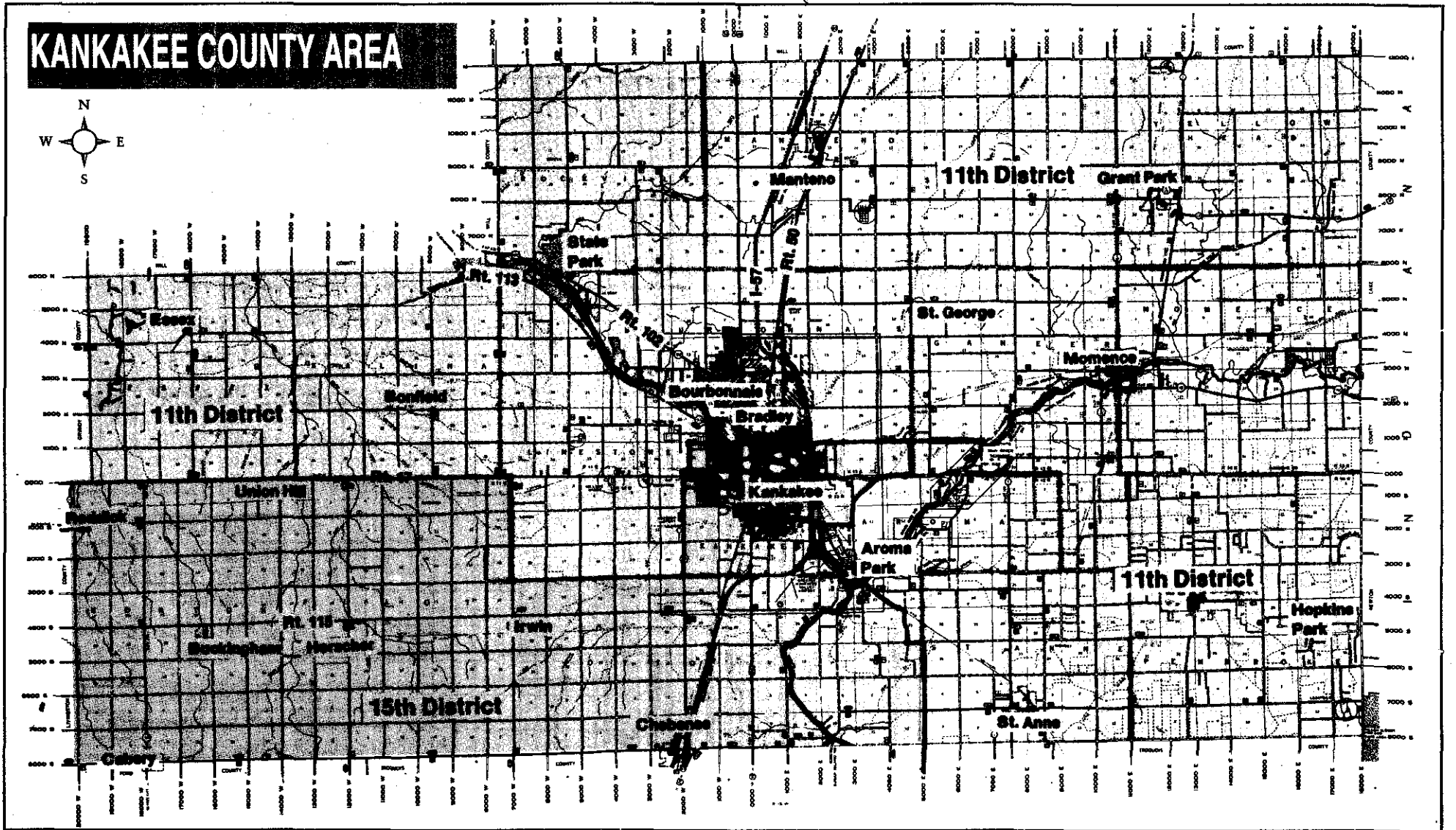


CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS

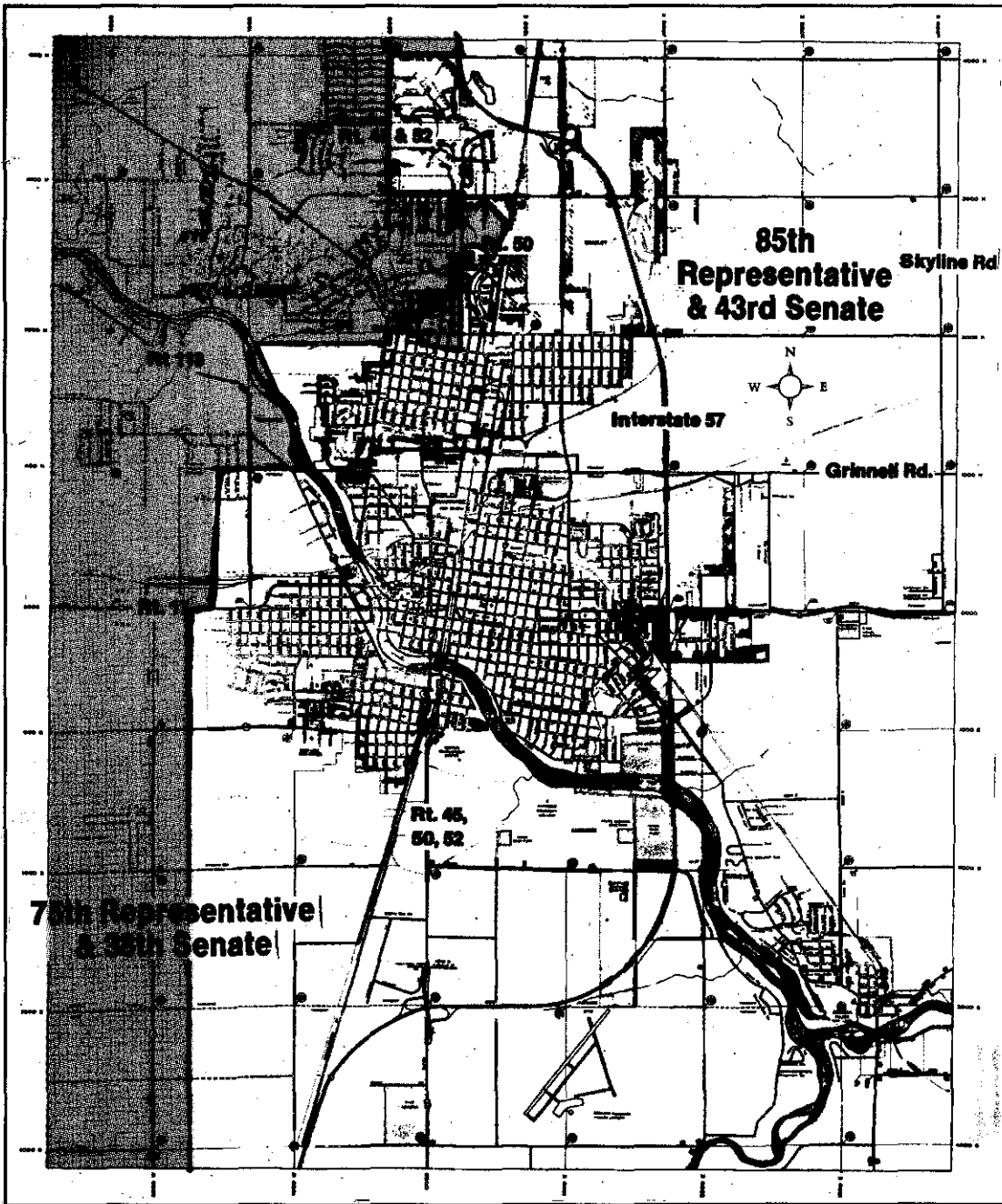
