

TO LOCATE YOUR PRECINCT

- 1. Find your precinct number and township on your voter registration card.
- 2. Use the listings on page 11 of this booklet to determine your precinct.

ON ENTERING THE POLLING PLACE

- 1. Give your name and address.
- 2. Sign an application for a ballot.
- 3. Make sure the ballot you are given is properly initialed by the Judge of Election.

CAUTION

- 1. If you are unsure of how to use the Vote Recorder, ask the Judge of Election for a demonstration.

VOTING FOR MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Each voter has only one vote for representative in the General Assembly, since representatives are now elected from single-member districts. The passage of the Cut-Back Amendment to the Illinois Constitution in November 1980 reduced the number of General Assembly members from 177 to 118 and provided for the election of one representative from each district. Therefore, the previous cumulative system no longer applies. A vote cast for a state representative candidate now gives that candidate only one vote.

PROPOSITIONS

To cast a ballot for a measure, punch the number next to the "Yes" statement. To cast a ballot against a measure, punch the number next to the "No" statement.







The proposed amendment to Article III, Soction 3, would make two changes in the Section setting torth voting qualifications for tillings residents, both of which conform the Binors Constitution to the requirements of federal law. Explanation of Proposed Amendment

Explanation of Proposed Amendment

The proposed Amendment deals with the problem of tax delinquency on commercial industrial, vacant non-farm, and large multi-unit residential properties. This has no effect on single-family homes, farms, or apartment buildings containing 6 or lever units. Present Bintons law attempts to place tax delinquent properties back on the tax rolls in addition to an Annual Sale which must be held each year recent changes in the law permit countes to conduct a "Scavenger Sale" for properties which are at least two years tax delinquent. The highest bidder at the Scavenger Sale receives a tax sale certificate. After the Scavenger Sale: the property owner is given a period of time to redeem the outstanding taxes. The certificate holder can take totle to the property after this recemption period has expeed.

The Constitution now quarantees the delinquent owner two years to pay back or redeem the delinquent axes after the Scavenger Sale, with some exceptions of a commercial, industrial, vacant non-farm or targe multifamily (? or more units) property is flive or interest delinquent axes after the Scavenger Sale, with some exceptions of a commercial, industrial, vacant non-farm or targe multifamily (? or more units) property is flive or interest seasonably to apply a six month redemption period to vacant non-farm, commercial, industrial and large multifamily properties which are time or inner given delinquent. Second, the proposed Amendment would allow the General Assembly to apply a one year redemption period to the same properties if they are less than two years delinquent. Note that the Constitution simply establishes guildelines for the General Assembly, which is required to set specific redemption periods through the reputal tepstative process.
