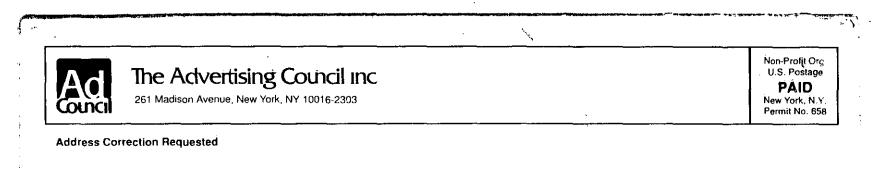
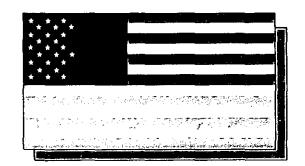

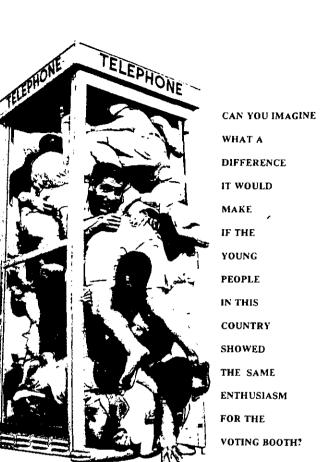

BACKGROUND

• The target audience is defined as adults 18+ who are eligible to vote. Special emphasis is placed on encouraging the unregistered to register.

• Past voting campaigns have helped to stem a twenty-year erosion in the percentage of the public who vote. In fact, in the last Federal Election, a total of 55.3% of the eligible public voted.
