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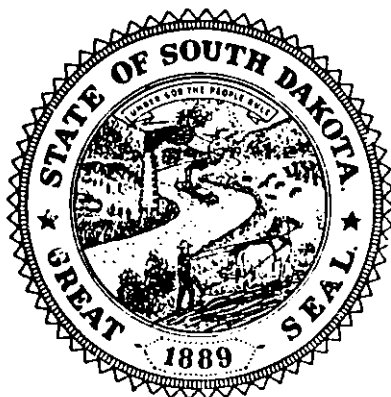

STATE LEGISLATORS	50 signatures or 1% of their party's vote for governor in their legislative district in the 1986 election, whichever is less, for party primary. Independents must have signatures equal to 1% of the total vote for governor in 1986 in their legislative district.
DEADLINE FOR FILING:	April 5, 1988, for primary election candidate August 2, 1988, as independent candidate in the general election
INITIATIVE PETITIONS SDCL 2-1-1, 2-1-5	14,723 signatures collected within one year prior to filing petitions (5% of 1986 total vote for governor). Signed petitions must be filed prior to adjournment of 1988 legislature.
REFERENDUM PETITIONS	14,723 signatures (5% of 1986 total vote for governor). Petitions must be filed within 90 days after adjournment of legislature at which the law was passed.
INITIATED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ART. XXIII, South Dakota Constitution	29,445 signatures (10% of 1986 total vote for governor). Signatures must be collected between November 4, 1985, and filing deadline of November 8, 1987.
COUNTY OFFICERS TO BE ELECTED IN 1988 Treasurer States Attorney Coroner	50 signatures or 1% of their party's vote for governor in 1986, whichever is less. Independents must have signatures equal to 1% of the total vote for governor in the county in 1986. Petitions are filed with the county auditor.

All petition signers must be registered voters (SDCL 2-1-6, 12-6-8).

INFORMATION SHEET
FOR CIRCULATION OF
PETITIONS FOR BALLOT QUESTIONS

1. A copy of any petition to be circulated to put a question on the general election ballot must be filed with the office of the Secretary of State prior to circulation for signatures (SDCL 2-1-6.1). No signatures obtained before that filing date will be counted.
2. There are three kinds of initiated ballot questions:
 - a. INITIATED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT: This is a petition proposing to amend, repeal, or add to provisions in the South Dakota State Constitution. The petition must have signatures of registered voters equal to ten per cent of the total vote for governor in the last gubernatorial election and must be filed in the Secretary of State's office by November 8, 1987, to be included on the 1988 general election ballot (S. D. Constitution, Art. XXIII, Sec. 1).
 - b. INITIATED MEASURE: This is a petition to add to, amend or repeal existing state statutes. Initiative petitions must be filed in the office of the Secretary of State prior to the close of the 1988 legislative session to be included on the 1988 general election ballot (SDCL 2-1-2). The petition must have signatures of registered voters equal to five per cent of the total vote for governor in the last gubernatorial election obtained within one year prior to filing the signatures with the Secretary of State (SDCL 2-1-1).
 - c. REFERRED LAW: This is a petition to prevent a measure passed by the Legislature from becoming effective. It must have signatures of registered voters equal to five per cent of the total vote for governor in the last gubernatorial election and must be filed within 90 days of adjournment of the legislative session in which the measure was passed. (SDCL 2-1-4). Measures which may be necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions are not subject to referendum.
3. Forms for petitions have been prescribed by the State Board of Elections according to law and are available from the office of the Secretary of State.
