## \*\*\*\*\* HOW TO VOTE YOUR BALLOT \*\*\*\*\*

THE BALLOT YOU ARE ISSUED INCLUDES:  
SIX Blue Cards marked "A" and ONE Yellow Card marked "B"

### 1. To Vote for Presidential Candidate & Pledged Delegates:

- Select ONE Blue "A" Card to vote for the Presidential Candidate of your choice and for convention delegates committed to that candidate.
- Place the remaining FIVE Blue "A" Cards in the secrecy envelope marked "NON-VOTED BALLOTS", with stubs showing.
- Vote the Blue "A" Card you have chosen and place the voted ballot in the plastic ballot holder, with stub showing.

\*\*\* DO NOT DETACH THE STUBS \*\*\*

### 2. To Vote for Delegate to the House of Representatives and Members of the Democratic National and State Committees.

- Vote BOTH SIDES of the Yellow "B" Card.
- Place the voted ballot in the ballot holder, with stub showing.

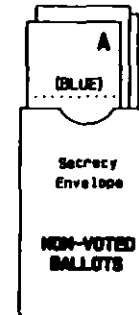
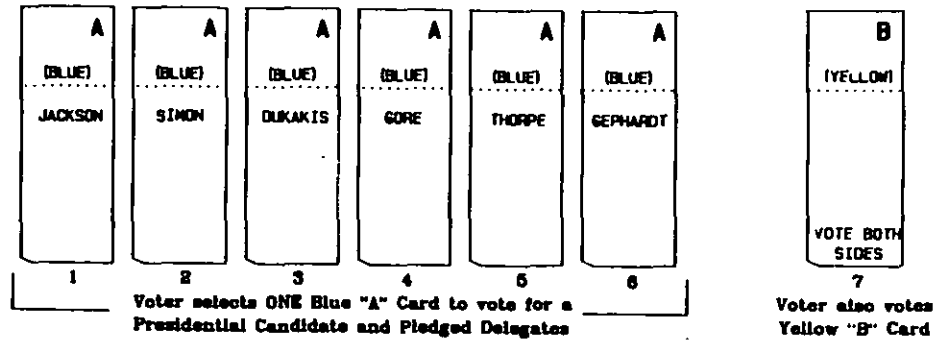

### 3. TO CAST YOUR BALLOT:

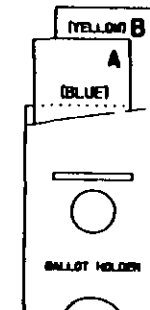
- Go first to the Clerk at the Ballot Box for "NON-VOTED BALLOTS". Hand the Clerk the secrecy envelope containing the FIVE non-voted Blue Cards.
- Then go to the Clerk at the Ballot Box for "VOTED BALLOTS". Hand the Clerk the plastic ballot holder containing your TWO VOTED ballot cards, ONE BLUE and ONE YELLOW.

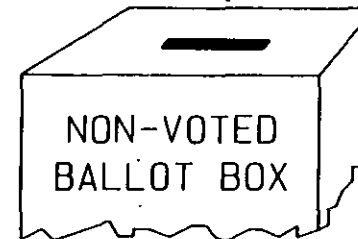
### THE DEMOCRATIC BALLOT



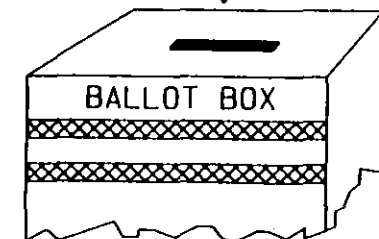
NON-VOTED BALLOTS:

\*\*\*\*\* HOW TO VOTE YOUR BALLOT \*\*\*\*\*

THE BALLOT YOU ARE ISSUED HAS TWO PARTS:  
TWO Green Cards and a White Envelope containing TWO Pink Cards

### PART I - GREEN BALLOTS

- Vote the Green "A" Card for ONE Presidential Candidate. READ BOTH SIDES of the card before voting.
- Vote the Green "B" Card for Delegate to the House of Representatives, National Committeeman, and National Committeewoman. Turn card over to vote for Ward Members of the D.C. Republican Committee, by slate or individual candidates.
- Place BOTH voted Green Cards in the plastic ballot holder, with stubs showing.

### PART II - PINK BALLOTS

Inside the sealed white envelope are TWO Pink Cards ("C-1" and "C-2") that you will use to vote for At-Large Members of the D.C. Republican Committee. This contest is so large that it exceeds the capacity of one punchcard ballot. You may vote for a total of no more than 48 persons from both Pink Cards. You may vote for an entire slate with one punch, or vote for candidates individually.

- Tamp the envelope down (to avoid tearing the ballots) and snap off the top end of the envelope where perforated. Remove TWO Pink Cards marked "C-1" and "C-2".
- Review both sides of each card before punching them to indicate your choice.
- Cast your 48 votes in one of the following ways:
  - To vote for all 48 on the "The Official D.C. Republican Committee" slate, make one punch after the slate name, at the beginning of Card "C-1". Make no more punches; you have voted the 48 votes to which you are entitled.
  - To vote for all 47 on the "Republican Party Builders" slate, make one punch after the slate name, at the beginning of Card "C-2". Make no more punches on Card "C-2"; you have already voted for everyone on that card.  
As you may vote for a total of 48, you may also punch for one more person, chosen from either side of Card "C-1", if you wish.
  - To vote for 48 individuals, punch any combination of 48 from among those printed on Cards "C-1" and "C-2". In this case, do not punch either slate position.
- PLACE BOTH PINK BALLOTS BACK INSIDE THE WHITE ENVELOPE. DO NOT DETACH THE STUBS. DO NOT PLACE ANY GREEN BALLOTS IN THE WHITE ENVELOPE.

Take the ballot holder containing both Green Ballot Cards and the White Envelope containing both Pink Ballot Cards to the Clerk at the red and white Ballot Box.
