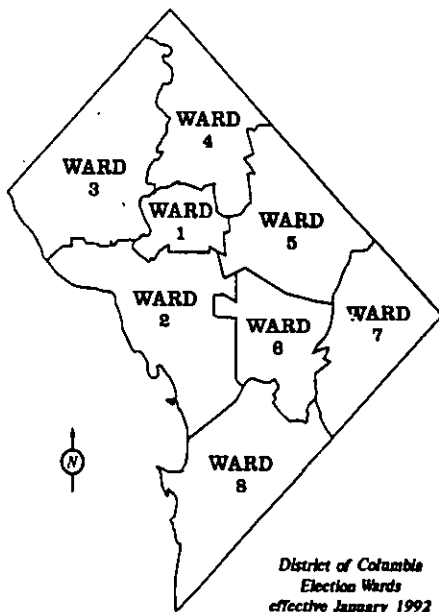

## September 10th Primary Election Ballot

On September 10, 1996 the Board of Elections and Ethics will conduct a Primary election for the Democratic, Republican, D.C. Statehood and Umoja parties. The following offices will appear on the ballot:

At-Large Member of the D.C. Council  
Ward 2 Member of the D.C. Council  
Ward 4 Member of the D.C. Council  
Ward 7 Member of the D.C. Council  
Ward 8 Member of the D.C. Council  
U.S. Senator  
U.S. Representative



Only voters registered with the Democratic, Republican, D.C. Statehood or Umoja parties are eligible to vote in the primary. Voters registered as independent will not be eligible to vote September 10th.

The candidate who receives the highest number of votes in the primary will become the party's nominee for the November 5th General Election. And along with any independent or minor party candidates — who gain access to the ballot directly by submitting nominating petitions — will be listed on the General Election ballot.
