Elections in the District of Columbia are scheduled for every even-numbered year, with the primary for partisan offices held in September and the general election held in November. In years where a presidential election occurs, a presidential preference primary is also held in May. This calendar lists elections scheduled in the District of Columbia through 1998. Other offices and measures (such as initiative, referendum, and recall) may be added to the ballot later.
