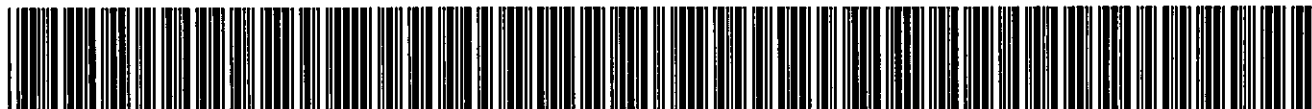

### COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

Members: All Members of the Council

Responsible for matters related to the annual budget, taxation and the raising of revenues, land use, council administration, congressional relations, reapportionment, and legislative scheduling.

### COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS

Chair: John Ray

Members: Brazil, Evans, Mason, Smith

Responsible for matters related to consumer affairs; the regulation of occupational, professional, commercial, real estate, housing activities (except housing inspectors); and banking and environmental activities related to consumer affairs.

### COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Chair: Charlene Drew Jarvis

Members: Cropp, Evans, Ray, Smith

Responsible for matters related to economic, industrial, and commercial development, as well as tourism and cable television, industrial revenue bonds, and the regulation of banks.

### COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION AND LIBRARIES

Chair: Hilda H. M. Mason

Members: Lightfoot, Patterson, Thomas

Responsible for matters related to public education and libraries.

### COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS

Chair: Harold Brazil

Members: Cropp, Patterson, Thomas

Responsible for matters related to elections, Advisory Neighborhood Commissions, general services, personnel and general administration of the District government.

### COMMITTEE ON HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS

Chair: Frank Smith

Members: Chavous, Jarvis, Mason, Ray

Responsible for matters related to development and maintenance of housing stock, including housing inspectors, the development of the comprehensive plan, and neighborhood improvement.

### COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES

Members: Jarvis, Ray, Smith, Thomas

Responsible for matters related to social services, health and welfare, youth and cultural affairs, energy and concerns of the aging.

### COMMITTEE ON THE JUDICIARY

Chair: William Lightfoot

Members: Brazil, Chavous, Evans, Ray

Responsible for matters affecting judiciary and judicial procedure within the Council's authority; estates and fiduciary affairs, administrative and criminal law, police and fire regulations; and other matters related to police protection, corrections, fire prevention, and civil defense.

### COMMITTEE ON LABOR AND HUMAN RIGHTS

Responsible for matters related to employment, manpower development, human rights, and Statehood and self-determination.

Responsible for matters related to recreation, sports, the Council's relationship with regional authorities, and regional public transportation issues.

Members: Brazil, Chavous, Evans, Smith

Responsible for matters related to environmental management and maintenance, public space, transportation, street maintenance, regulation of motor vehicles and taxicabs, recycling, and water and sewage treatment.
