IF YOU HAVE MOVED from the address on the card, you must vote at the polling place in your new neighborhood. Here's how:

- 1. Go to the polling place serving your <u>new</u> address. (Call us ahead of time at 727-2525 for your new voting location.)
- 2. Bring an I.D. that shows your name and <u>current</u> address, such as:
  - A driver's license or non-driver's I.D.
  - An employer or government I.D. card
  - A lease, deed, utility bill, or other I.D. document showing that you live at the new address
- 3. Fill out a form for election day change of address. The clerk will give you a ballot. A new Voter Card will be mailed to you.

PLEASE NOTE: Your ward, precinct, ANC, or voting location may have changed due to "redistricting". This process changes election boundaries to put equal numbers of residents in each election district. Redistricting takes place every 10 years, based on new U.S. Census data. The D.C. Council approved new boundaries in January, 1992.

#### ADVISORY NEIGHBORHOOD COMMISSIONS

On November 3rd, you may vote for a representative to your local Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC). The ANC advises the D.C. government on community issues such as zoning, police protection, and liquor licensing.

The city is divided into 37 ANCs. Each ANC holds monthly public meetings where it reports to the community and hears from citizens.

Each ANC is divided into Single Member Districts (SMDs) that each represent about 2,000 residents. There are 299 SMDs in all. You will vote to elect an ANC Commissioner from your SMD.

ANC Commissioners are not paid a salary. They are elected every two years in the General Election.

#### UNITED STATES REPRESENTATIVE

"United States Representative" is a <u>local</u> D.C. office, which has the same title as the <u>federal</u> office that will be created if the District becomes a state.
