"He believed that investing in the next generation of leaders was the right thing to do and devoted his time and resources to make it a reality."






At the state level, he chaired the California/Southern California Democratic Party and served on the National Committee of the California Democratic Party.



In 1999, former President Bill Clinton appointed Manatt as the U.S. Ambassador to the Dominican Republic.



As ambassador, Manatt emphasized election administration reform and greater cooperation between the Dominican Republic and the United States' criminal justice systems.



Manatt served as chairman of IFES' Board of Directors from 1993 to 1999 and was a distinct leader.



He had an unwavering commitment to spreading democracy around the world and helping those who are less fortunate.

He and his family established the Charles and Kathleen Manatt Fellowship at IFES' Center for Applied Research and Learning.




The Charles and Kathleen Manatt Fellowship awards graduate students from the American Midwest the opportunity to work with IFES experts and conduct research on democracy and governance.
